



2025 Jim Mason High School Teams Tournament

- We used Club Locker for the first time this year to get the kids engaged with the platform and provide a link to the University system which is also on Club Locker.
- We had 17 Emerging Teams - usually we get 5-7 teams. This was huge!
- Division 1 & 2 had to be combined with a total of 8 teams.
- Great event and we will likely look to host this at White Oaks in the future since there are so many teams from Niagara/Sarnia who come. I'm told that our Emerging Teams division could double if hosted in Niagara.

2025 Junior Awards Ceremony



Notes from our last Executive Meeting



Squash Ontario Update

- Lynsey Yates reported that player membership is up 32% over two years, reaching 10,000 player goal
- Ontario Open maintained record-breaking participation
- Junior Open showing 8% growth year-over-year for past four years
- 14 member courts were lost in the past year, raising concerns about court availability
- Squash Ontario launching a court advocacy group to address court loss

Tournament Statistics & Initiatives

- Total junior tournament participation up 27% year-over-year, 14% increase since pre-COVID
- Grand Prix level (grassroots) tournaments saw largest increase
- Junior Silver events facing challenges, possibly due to 'COVID gap'
- Provincial championships and community tournaments saw 2% decrease
- Ontario had 26 athletes named to national squads, representing 50% of all national squad athletes

Community Outreach Programs

- Community outreach coordinator reached 1,000 students through school gymnasium programs
- New acrylic three-wall mini court initiative launching this summer to travel across province
- Mobile court will visit high-traffic areas including Young-Eglinton Square, Kingston, Ajax, and Guelph
- Two summer students will be hired to transport the court and promote squash

Squash Canada Update

- Jamie Nicholls reported nationwide membership up 10% since 2019
- Participation up 21% over 2019 levels
- Revenue from non-government sources up 52% through Glasscore program and events
- Base funding remains unchanged since 2005 despite 52% inflation
- Olympic inclusion not providing immediate funding but opens future opportunities

Olympic Updates (25:16 – 32:30)

- LA 2028 Olympic squash event details developing: 32 males, 32 females, limit of 2 per country
- Venue likely to seat around 2,000 spectators
- Canada applying to 'Own the Podium' program for high-performance funding
- Olympic status decision for Brisbane 2032 expected in 2026
- Canadian National Championships at Cricket Club will feature approximately 750 players
