On October 20-23, the Ontario Jesters hosted the 1st Frank MacKay Doubles at Cedar Springs and Burlington Racquet Club.



To say that the 60 teams who participated in the event had a good time would be an understatement. The level of squash was acceptable, the food even better, the liquids were outstanding and finally at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoon we suggested that they go home.

When we decided to hold this event to celebrate the life of a good guy, it was also thought that it should be more than another doubles event. Thus the idea to raise funds for The Joseph Brant Memorial Hospital to purchase a cardiac unit.

Our goal was accomplished and the event raised \$35,000 to purchase a Zoll Defibrillator.

The hospital will also name a room in Frank's honour.

We did not think that donations alone would generate the necessary funds to purchase the equipment. Thus the decision to hold a silent auction.

Some 70 items were sold at the Saturday evening dinner. To our shock and delight, the total funds raised exceeded \$26,000.

With the combination of entry fees, patrons and the silent auction, we were able to purchase the cardiac equipment and will make a significant contribution to the Ontario Jesters Junior Squash Fund.

As well, funds have been be put aside for next year's event.

## **JIM BIDDELL - A JESTER OF 54 YEARS**

It is with sadness that we report on the death of Jim Biddell of London. Jim became a Jester in 1951, one of the first Canadians to be nominated since the Club officially opened a Canadian branch in 1948.

Jim spent some 36 years in the

investment industry in London and was much involved in golf and tennis at the London Hunt and squash at the London Squash Club. He was a founding member of the London Squash Club and a past president.
